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1. MANAGER'S SUMMARY

Oakville Hydro Electricity Distribution Inc. ("Oakville Hydro") is incorporated pursuant to the Ontario Business Corporations Act with its head office in the Town of Oakville. Oakville Hydro carries on the business of distributing electricity within the Town of Oakville. Oakville Hydro hereby applies to the Ontario Energy Board (the "OEB"), pursuant to Section 78 of the Ontario Energy OEB Act, 1998 (the "OEB Act"), for approval of its proposed adjustments to its distribution rates and other charges, effective January 1, 2027.

Oakville Hydro has followed Chapter 3 of the OEB's *Filing Requirements For Electricity Distribution Rate Applications* dated July 14, 2026, to prepare this Annual IR Application (the "Application").

The Schedule of Rates and Charges proposed in this Application is provided as Appendix 1. The proposed rates reflect an adjustment to the rates previously approved by the OEB on December 11, 2025, OEB File Number EB-2025-0016.

The specific approvals requested are:

- a) An annual IR index adjustment;
- b) The continuation of the current low voltage service charges as approved in EB-2013-0159;
- c) The approval for the proposed adjustments to the current Retail Transmission Service Rates as approved in Oakville Hydro's 2026 application, EB-2025-0016;
- d) The approval for the final disposition of Oakville Hydro's Group 1 variance accounts as at December 31, 2025 with interest to December 31, 2026;
- e) The continuation of existing specific service charges and loss factors as approved in EB-2013-0159 and amended in EB-2024-0047;
- f) The approval to recover lost revenue related to conservation and demand management programs under the Conservation First Framework, and
- g) The approval of rate riders for the previously approved LRAM-eligible amount for 2027.

If the Application is approved as filed, Oakville Hydro's residential and small business customers will see the following bill impacts:

- Residential: A typical residential customer using 750 kWh in a month will see a decrease of \$0.74 or 0.53% in their total monthly bill.
- General Service < 50 kW: A typical General Service < 50 kW will see a decrease of \$2.30 or 0.64% in their total monthly bill.

Oakville Hydro requests that this Application be disposed of by way of a written hearing. In the event that the OEB is unable to provide a Decision and Order on this Application for implementation effective January 1, 2027, Oakville Hydro requests that the OEB issue an Interim Rate Order declaring its current Tariff of Rates and Charges as interim until the implementation date of the approved 2027 distribution rates.

1 **4. RATE GENERATOR**

2 Oakville Hydro has provided a copy of the OEB's 2027 Rate Generator model, in excel format, in support
3 of this Application. Oakville Hydro confirms that it has verified the accuracy of the billing determinants in
4 the pre-populated Rate Generator model.

5 **5. WHO WILL BE AFFECTED?**

6 Oakville Hydro's customers, including its embedded distributor, will be affected by this Application.

7 **6. BILL IMPACTS**

8 If the Application is approved as filed, a typical residential customer using 750 kWh per month will see a
9 decrease of \$0.74 or 0.53% in their total monthly bill. A customer in the General Service < 50 kW class
10 using 2,000 kWh per month will see a decrease of \$2.30 or 0.64% in their total monthly bill. Detailed bill
11 impact schedules are provided in Appendix 2.

12 **7. CURRENT TARIFF OF RATES AND CHARGES**

13 Oakville Hydro's current tariff of rates and charges effective January 1, 2026, EB-2025-0016, is provided
14 as Appendix 3.

15 **8. ANNUAL ADJUSTMENT MECHANISM**

16 In accordance with the Filing Requirements, Oakville Hydro has used the 2027 inflation factor of 3.0% as
17 issued by the OEB on June 11, 2026.

18 The price cap adjustment used in the 2027 Rate Generator is 2.4%. This calculation is based upon a price
19 escalator of 3.0%, a productivity factor of 0.00% and the stretch factor of 0.60% assigned to distributors
20 filing under the Annual IR framework.

21 **9. RATE DESIGN FOR RESIDENTIAL ELECTRICITY CUSTOMERS**

22 On April 2, 2015, the OEB released its *OEB Policy: A New Distribution Rate Design for Residential Electricity*
23 *Customers* (EB-2014-0210). This policy required that electricity distributors transition to fully fixed rates
24 for residential customers over a period of four years, beginning in 2016, while considering the need to
25 mitigate rate impacts for customers. Oakville Hydro completed the transition to fully fixed rates in 2019
26 and no further adjustments are required.

10. ELECTRICITY DISTRIBUTION RETAIL TRANSMISSION SERVICE RATES

Oakville Hydro has calculated the adjustment to the current Retail Transmission Service Rates (RTSR) as approved in its 2026 Annual IR application, EB-2025-0016. Oakville Hydro is proposing that the RTSR Connection and RTSR Network rates be adjusted as shown in Table 1. The detailed calculations can be found in the 2027 Rate Generator model filed in support of this application.

All General Service 50 To 999 kW Service customers have been transitioned to interval meters, with a separate rate no longer required.

Oakville Hydro notes that the proposed RTSR rates for all rate classes decreased on average by 3.5%. This change is driven by 2027 IESO Uniform Transmission Rates and 2027 Hydro One Sub-Transmission Rates in the 2027 Rate Generator model being set at current 2026 rates, see table 2 below. The resulting flat wholesale billing has a similar effect on the calculated distribution RTSR.

11. REVIEW AND DISPOSITION OF GROUP 1 DEFERRAL AND VARIANCE ACCOUNT BALANCES

11.1 OVERVIEW

The *Report of the OEB on Electricity Distributors' Deferral and Variance Account Review* (the "EDVAR Report") provides that a distributors' Group 1 audited account balances be reviewed and disposed of if the disposition threshold of \$0.001 per kWh is exceeded. Oakville Hydro's Group 1 audited balances eligible for disposition as at December 31, 2025, with projected interest to December 31, 2026, excluding the LRAM variance account, is \$(9,762,554) or \$0.0056 per kWh, which is above the disposition threshold. Therefore, Oakville Hydro is requesting approval to dispose of the balance of its 2025 Group 1 deferral and variance accounts on a final basis over a one-year period. The proposed rate riders, as calculated by the Rate Generator model, are provided in Table 4 and 5.

Oakville Hydro confirms that the balances in Account 1595 sub-accounts have only been disposed of once. Disposition of residual balances is requested two years after the expiry of the rate rider. Group 1 account balances as of December 31, 2024 were approved for disposition on a final basis in Oakville Hydro's 2026 application, EB-2025-0016.

11.2 WHOLESALE MARKET PARTICIPANTS

Oakville Hydro confirms that it has not allocated any balances related to commodity and market-related charges to its wholesale market participant.

11.3 EXPLANATION OF RRR VARIANCES

The Rate Generator model is prepopulated with the Group 1 RSVA balances filed by Oakville Hydro in accordance with the OEB's Reporting and Record Keeping Requirements (RRR). Distributors are required to provide an explanation of any variances between the amounts reported through the RRR and the continuity schedule in the Rate Generator. The following table and accompanying notes summarize the variances and provide the required explanations.

In accordance with the guidance provided in the 2017 Orientation Session¹ for cost-of-service filers, Oakville Hydro has excluded amounts related to the Variance WMS – Sub-account CBR Class

A and Variance WMS – Sub-account CBR Class B from the 1580 RSVA – WMS Charge account in the continuity schedule. However, the value that is automatically populated from the RRR filings includes these amounts. Therefore, the continuity schedule in the Rate Generator model shows a variance for this account equal to the amounts in the sub-accounts.

- **RSVA – Power and RSVA – Global Adjustment**

These differences represent the principal adjustments made to adjust the transactions in the general ledger to the amount that should be requested for disposition, in this case, for transactions posted in 2026.

11.4 ADJUSTMENTS TO VARIANCE ACCOUNT BALANCES

Oakville Hydro has not made any adjustments to balances previously approved by the OEB on a final basis.

11.5 CAPACITY BASED RECOVERY (CBR)

Oakville Hydro has followed the OEB's CBR accounting guidance on the disposition of CBR variances. The calculation of the CBR Class B rate riders does not result in a rate rider that rounds to zero at the fourth decimal place, therefore a separate CBR Class B rate rider has been calculated.

12. GLOBAL ADJUSTMENT

12.1 CLASS B AND A CUSTOMERS

Oakville Hydro bills its Class B customers based upon the first estimate of the global adjustment for all rate classes, including the one customer in Oakville Hydro's embedded distributor rate class. Class A customers are billed based upon actual Class A global adjustment charges therefore, there are no Class A global adjustment variance balances. In accordance with the Filing Requirements, Oakville Hydro has established a separate rate rider for its non-RPP Class B customers based on energy consumption.

12.2 COMMODITY ACCOUNTS ANALYSIS WORK FORM

The Commodity Accounts Analysis Work Form is provided as Appendix 4. A live Excel version is also being filed in support of this Application.

- the unresolved differences for global adjustment from the Commodity Accounts Analysis Work Form is within the OEB's 1% tolerance range
- the unresolved differences for the cost of power from the Commodity Accounts Analysis Work Form of 2.3% is outside the OEB's 1% tolerance range. Oakville Hydro is working on a full analysis and will report the findings to the OEB when completed. Analysis to date confirms 1.4% of the variance is directly attributable to minor differences in the weighted average price per kWh billed to customers and that paid per kWh to the IESO. The remaining variance is made up of variances between actual and accrued unbilled revenues caused by volume and rate differences.

12.3 COMMODITY ACCOUNTS 1588 AND 1589

On February 21, 2019, the OEB issued its letter entitled *Accounting Guidance related to Accounts 1588 Power, and 1589 Retail Settlement Variance Account (RSVA) Global Adjustment* (the “OEB Guidance”) as well as the related accounting guidance. The accounting guidance was effective January 1, 2019, and was to be implemented by August 31, 2019. Oakville Hydro confirms that it has implemented the new accounting guideline effective January 1, 2019.

Distributors are also expected to consider the accounting guidance in the context of historical balances that have yet to be disposed of on a final basis.

Oakville Hydro submits that it has taken the appropriate steps to ensure the accuracy of the balances of accounts 1588 and 1589 as they relate to the OEB Guidance and is seeking approval for the final disposition of its 2025 Group 1 variance account balances.

13. LOST REVENUE ADJUSTMENT MECHANISM VARIANCE ACCOUNT

13.1 LRAMVA BALANCE

Oakville Hydro confirms it has a zero balance in the LRAMVA and is not requesting any disposition.

13.2 LRAM – ELIGIBLE AMOUNTS PREVIOUSLY APPROVED

Oakville Hydro requested, and was granted, approval of the 2023 to 2027 LRAM-eligible amounts in its 2023 IRM Rate Application, EB-2022-0055. Table 7 below summarises the amounts approved.

Oakville Hydro is requesting rate riders for 2027 rates to recover the 2027 LRAM-eligible amount approved in EB-2022-0055². The LRAM-eligible amount approved for 2027 of \$261,736 has been adjusted to \$305,763 using the 2023, 2024, 2025, 2026 and 2027 inflation parameters as issued by the OEB and the stretch factor value attributable to Oakville Hydro. The billing determinants used to calculate the rate riders are the total metered kWh/kW as reported in Oakville Hydro's most recent RRR filing. Table 8 below illustrates the calculations used to generate the requested LRAM-eligible rate riders.

Oakville Hydro is proposing to dispose of the 2027 LRAM amount of \$305,763 over a one-year period beginning January 1, 2027 by way of a variable rate rider for the impacted rate classes as shown above in Table 8.

1 **14. TAX CHANGES**

2 Oakville Hydro has completed Tab 8 of the Rate Generator Model which results in an incremental tax
3 impact of zero. There are no identified legislated tax changes for the 2027 rate year from those assumed
4 in Oakville Hydro's base distribution rates.

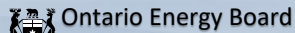

The IESO settlement form (previously known as 1588 forms) reconciles the cost of power (energy commodity) using final Kwh's delivered (AQEW) and cost per Kwh delivered. These amounts are reflected on the IESO invoice under code 1115. When these Kwh's are sold by Oakville Hydro to customers, the invoiced energy rate per Kwh will not align exactly with the cost per Kwh paid by Oakville Hydro to the IESO. These differences result in 2025 energy revenues exceeding cost paid to the IESO by \$1.85M, or 1.4% of power purchased in 2025.

Explanations for the remaining 0.9% of the variance are difficult to pinpoint but would typically include variances to actual in accrual assumptions. Revenue accruals are prepared close to month end and will always have some variance to actual revenues due to estimates used for consumption amounts and billing rates. Volume variances between the initial IESO settlement and the second true-up have ranged between 2% and 6% over the last 12 months. A 5% over accrual Dec 2025 would generate approx 1.0% in movement in the Power variance account.
